CONDITIONAL PROMOTION TEST (Year 9 Students)

The CP test for students of Year 9 of the academic session 2025– 2026 is scheduled to be conducted on **Monday, 17 August 2026 (9 am starting time- KAAS Block)**. Schedule, applicable subjects and important details are already shared with the parents through the inserts given along with the result envelopes. Students appearing in the CP tests will not be allowed to attend the classes until the result of the CP test is declared and informed by the School. All students must obtain a minimum of 60% marks to qualify for the next grade level. Attending the CP Test is mandatory for the informed students.

STUDENT DISCIPLINE INFARCTIONS

PISJ-ES places a high premium on maintaining a rigorous and respectful learning environment. This memo serves to address the types of violations, repercussions and to clarify the expectations for student conduct. The detailed content is available as Annex A.

ELECTRONIC AND PROHIBITED ITEMS

Senior School maintains a strict policy regarding the possession of electronic devices on campus. Students are not permitted to bring mobile phones, smartwatches with communication features, cameras, tablets, laptops, or any other personal electronic devices to school on any occasion. Students found in possession of such devices may be subject to disciplinary action, including the issuance of formal warning letters and the confiscation of the device in accordance with school procedures. Students are also strongly discouraged from bringing valuable personal belongings to school. The school cannot accept responsibility for the loss, theft, or damage of any personal items brought onto campus.

Furthermore, the possession, use, distribution, or sale of prohibited items (including but not limited to vapes, e-cigarettes, tobacco products, lighters, sharp objects or any item that may pose a risk to the safety and well-being of the school community) is strictly forbidden. Such violations are considered serious

disciplinary offences and may result in severe consequences, including suspension or permanent expulsion from the school. Parents are requested to support the school by ensuring that students comply fully with these expectations before leaving for school each day.

RESPONSIBLE SOCIAL MEDIA USAGE

The school encourages students to use technology and social media responsibly, ethically, and with good judgment. Students should understand that not everything they hear, read, or see online is necessarily accurate or truthful. Information shared through social media, websites, messaging applications, or other digital platforms should be approached critically and verified before being believed, shared, or forwarded to others.

Students are strongly advised not to develop the habit of unnecessarily photographing or recording people, incidents, or situations and posting such content online. Respect for the privacy and dignity of others must always be maintained. Photographs, videos, or recordings of any student or staff member should not be taken, shared, or published without their knowledge and consent. Particular care should be exercised when using social media platforms, messaging applications, and other online forums. Students should also be mindful that content shared online may remain accessible for a long time and may have lasting consequences on their reputation and the reputation of others.

Any misuse of social media, including the unauthorized sharing of photographs, videos, personal information, or misleading content, may result in school disciplinary action. In addition, certain actions may constitute violations of local laws and regulations and could lead to legal consequences under the applicable laws of the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia.

CYBERBULLYING, DEFAMATION AND ONLINE CONDUCT

The school is committed to maintaining a safe, respectful, and inclusive environment for all students. Any form of cyberbullying, online harassment, defamation, or inappropriate digital conduct is strictly prohibited, whether it occurs on or off campus. Cyberbullying includes, but is not limited to, creating or sharing offensive memes, spreading false information or rumours about other students or members of the school community, posting or forwarding derogatory comments, insulting messages, embarrassing photos or videos, impersonating others online, or using social media, messaging platforms, gaming platforms, or any digital medium to harm, threaten, intimidate, or ridicule another person.

Any student found engaging in cyberbullying, defamation, harassment, or the creation and distribution of harmful or inappropriate digital content will face disciplinary consequences. Their action(s) may also constitute violations of local laws and regulations and may result in legal action by the relevant authorities. Parents are encouraged to monitor their children's online activities and work in partnership with the school to promote responsible digital citizenship and respectful online behaviour.

LEAVE POLICY

Regular school attendance is essential for student learning and academic success, as it ensures that valuable instructional time is utilised effectively. For this reason, the school considers attendance to be closely linked to academic achievement and has established policies and procedures to encourage and require regular attendance.

When a student is absent frequently or misses school without approved leave, they may miss important lessons, graded assignments, assessments, tests, and examinations, which can significantly impact their academic performance and overall results. Furthermore, all leave requests should be submitted (to student affairs department through query portal) in a timely manner (within 3 days of absence) and supported by the necessary documentation to allow the school to review and approve them appropriately.

ACADEMIC POLICY

Year 8 - Y9: A student's promotion to the next grade level is subject to qualify following Conditions:

1. Achieving a minimum of 50% in every subject
2. Achieving a minimum of 60% aggregate across all subjects
3. Regular attendance

Retention: A student failing to qualify the above conditions will be retained in the same grade level.

Y10 – AL: As students are externally assessed at the end of these grade levels, promotion is *strictly subject* to the CIE exam results.

1. Year 10 to AS Level: A student must qualify the IGCSE/ O Level/ similar level of international qualification (i.e., achieves the minimum 'passing' grade in external assessments) to be eligible for promotion to AS Level.

- Any Year 10 student who receives a U grade, i.e., fails to achieve the minimum 'passing' grade in the external assessment of any subject, will not be eligible to proceed for A levels. IGCSE needs to be fully cleared to qualify for the A levels.

- A student must receive a minimum of C grade to opt for the same subject in AS Level, especially for Science Subjects.

- Students who achieve D and E grades will be redirected, encouraged to other Social Sciences subjects

- To be eligible for AS Pure Science Subjects (Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Mathematics and Computer Science) the student must have cleared the IGCSE/ O Level/ similar level qualification in the given subjects.

- A student who has taken Commerce subjects (Accounting, Economics, Business) in IGCSE cannot opt for Science subjects at AS Level.

2. **AS Level to A2/ A Level:** AS students who fail to achieve the minimum ‘passing’ grade in CIE exams (i.e., receive a U grade) of any subject, must choose between one of the following routes:

- **Retention:** To repeat the AS Level if student fails in two or more subjects, (i.e., retake all the subjects at AS Level) and re-sit for the AS Level CIE Examinations in the following June exam series.
- **Promotion:** Students unable to qualify in max one subject in AS may be promoted to A2 level with the condition that they register for composite of that one subject and for all A2 components/papers of the Cambridge International A Level syllabus (AS and A Level both) in the next June exam series.
- Composite - grade improvement for more than one subject is not allowed in A levels.

Example: If a student is registered for Physics, Chemistry, and Biology in AS Level and scores a U grade in only Biology, the student will be required to register for all component exams of Biology only (AS/AL both) in the next June Series.
